BIOGRAPHY

PROFESSOR BOBBY SCHNABEL

Bobby Schnabel is Dean of the School of Informatics at Indiana University. In this position he leads a multi-campus school of approximately 100 faculty members at the Bloomington and Indianapolis campuses, including undergraduate and graduate programs in the departments of computer science and informatics at Bloomington and in informatics at Indiana University Purdue University Indianapolis. He is a Professor of Computer Science and Informatics at Indiana University Bloomington. From 2009-2010 he also served as interim Indiana University Vice President for research.

Prior to joining Indiana University in July 2007, Dr. Schnabel worked in the Computer Science Faculty of the University of Colorado at Boulder from 1977-2007. He served as Vice Provost for Academic and Campus Technology and Chief Information Officer at the University of Colorado at Boulder from 1998-2007, and as founding director of the Alliance for Technology, Learning and Society (ATLAS), a campus-wide information technology institute, from 1997-2007.

Dr. Schnabel's teaching and research interests are in the areas of scientific and parallel computation, including applications to molecular chemistry problems. He is the author of over 100 technical papers and has given over 50 invited conference presentations. He is a co-founder and executive team member of the National Center for Women & Information Technology, a non-profit organization aimed at increasing women's participation in IT education and careers, and is chair of the ACM Education Policy Committee. He has served as editor-in-chief of the flagship journal of the Society for Applied and Industrial Mathematics, SIAM Review; as a member of the Board of Directors of the Computing Research Association; and as chair of the Information Technology Deans group of CRA. He is a fellow of ACM and of SIAM.
